

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WINSLOW HOMER Crosscurrents



A timely study of Winslow Homer highlighting his imagery of the Atlantic world and revealing themes of racial, political, and natural conflict across his career

Long celebrated as the quintessential New England regionalist, Winslow Homer (1836-1910) in fact brushed a much wider canvas, traveling throughout the Atlantic world and frequently engaging in his art with issues of race, imperialism, and the environment. This publication focuses, for the first time, on the watercolors and oil paintings Homer made during visits to Bermuda, Cuba, coastal Florida, and the Bahamas. Among these, *The Gulf Stream* (1899), often considered the most consequential painting of his career, reveals Homer's lifelong fascination with struggle and conflict. Recognizing the artist's keen ability to distill complex issues, *Winslow Homer: Crosscurrents* upends popular conceptions and convincingly argues that Homer's work resonates with the challenges of the present day.



The first comprehensive monograph and retrospective on Bernd and Hilla Becher, best known for their photographs of industrial structures in Europe and North America

For more than five decades, Bernd (1931-2007) and Hilla (1934-2015) Becher collaborated on photographs of industrial architecture in Germany, France, Belgium, Holland, Great Britain, and the United States. This sweeping monograph features the Bechers' quintessential pictures, which present water towers, gas tanks, blast furnaces, and the like as sculptural objects. Beyond the Bechers' iconic Typologies, the book includes Bernd's early drawings, Hilla's independent photographs, and excerpts from their notes, sketchbooks, and journals. The book's authors offer new insights into the development of the artists' process, their work's conceptual underpinnings, the photographs' relationship to deindustrialization, and the artists' legacy. Showcasing the technical, architectural, and emotional aspects of their output, this volume offers an unrivaled look into the Bechers' art, life, and subjects.

An introduction to the complex stories of Mesoamerican divinity through the carvings, ceramics, and metalwork of the Maya Classic period

Lives of the Gods explains the cosmological underpinnings of some of the greatest creative achievements of Maya civilization. Focusing on the Classic period (A.D. 250-900), the publication reveals how artists and scribes used diverse media—from the monumental to the miniature—to construct an aesthetic and rhetoric of a powerful universe, as rich and complex as the more familiar Greco-Roman, Hindu-Buddhist, and Egyptian pantheons. Thematic chapters detail the different types of gods and their domains while also examining the central role of the landscape in Maya religion, the importance of divinity in the daily lives of Maya kings and queens, and the continuation of these traditions by Maya communities from the colonial period through the present day.



A reckoning of the central role of enslaved and free Black artists in the long-standing stoneware pottery traditions of Edgefield, South Carolina

Recentering the development of industrially scaled Southern pottery traditions around enslaved and free Black potters working in the mid-nineteenth century, this catalogue features groundbreaking new scholarship on alkaline-glazed stoneware made in Edgefield, South Carolina. Among the remarkable works included are masterpieces by David Drake, known as "Dave the Potter," who signed, dated, and incised verses on many of his jars, even though literacy among enslaved people was criminalized at the time. In addition to surfacing new research on the production, collection, dispersal, and cultural significance of stoneware works from Edgefield, this publication also offers a critical look at what it means to collect, exhibit, and interpret objects made by enslaved artisans.


This new look at the artistic legacy of the Tudors reveals the dynasty's influence on the arts in Renaissance England and beyond

Ruling from 1485 through 1603, the five Tudor monarchs brought changes to England that reverberated throughout Europe. This rare, comprehensive look at Tudor artistic patronage examines how the work of the best European artists and artisans legitimized the family's tumultuous rule—from Henry VII's seizure of the throne that ended the Wars of the Roses, through Henry VIII's epoch-making breach with the Roman Catholic Church, to the influential reign of the "virgin queen" Elizabeth I. Including the latest scholarship and new photography of royal commissions, *The Tudors* explores this family's extreme politics and personalities and the visual arts' pivotal role in the dynasty's diplomatic relations at home and abroad.



An exploration of the crucial role of Jacques Louis David's drawings in his iconic history paintings made before, during, and after the French Revolution

The paintings of Jacques Louis David (1748-1825) are among the most iconic in the history of Western art, but comparatively little is known about the artist's nearly 2,000 drawings—from quick chalk sketches scribbled in notebooks to exquisite ink compositions enlivened with oil paint—that formed the basis of beloved masterpieces such as *The Oath of the Horatii* and *The Death of Socrates*. Essays by international experts on the artist explore how David's preparatory works on paper reveal the development of his creative process during a tumultuous time in French history. As both a participant and an observer, David helped establish the new French society while documenting the drama, violence, and triumphs of modern history in the making.


Reexamining Jean-Baptiste Carpeaux's Why Born Enslaved!, this volume unpacks the sculpture's complex engagement with the antislavery movement

This clear-eyed look at depictions of the Black figure discusses how categories of racial difference grew in popularity in nineteenth-century France alongside a crescendo in cultural production during the Second Empire. Focusing on *Why Born Enslaved!*, Carpeaux's bust of a bound Black woman, the authors compare the work to that of the artist's contemporaries on both sides of the Atlantic, as well as to objects by twenty-firstcentury artists Kara Walker and Kehinde Wiley. This publication also examines such key themes as the portrayal of Black enslavement and emancipation; the commodification of images of Black figures; the role of sculpture in generating the sympathies of its audiences; and the relevance of Carpeaux's sculpture to legacies of empire.


A new presentation of American fashion explores work by pioneering designers, who established the nation's style, and the up-and-coming designers shaping its future



The untold modern history of the Japanese kimono and its dynamic relationship to Western culture

Though often presented in the West as an unchanging, traditional costume, the Japanese kimono dynamically evolved from the Edo period to the modern age. This publication explores the kimono's modern history and cross-cultural dialogue with Western fashion. Initially signaling the wearer's social position, marital status, age, and wealth, kimono designs gave way to the demands of modernized and democratized twentieth-century lifestyles as well as the preferences of the emancipated "new woman." Conversely, inspiration from the kimono's silhouette liberated Western designers from traditional European tailoring. Establishing the complexity of Japan's fashion trends and systems alongside those of Western couture, this book places the kimono on the stage of global fashion history.



For Charles Ray (born 1953), sculpture is a way of thinking that informs his work across a wide range of media—from gelatin silver prints to porcelain, fiberglass, wood, and steel. This publication spans the whole of the artist's fifty-year career, from his early photographs and performances through his intriguing, often unsettling sculptures, some of which are published here for the first time. The essays foreground Ray's engagement with artistic tradition as well as charged issues around race, gender, and sexuality, and investigate the modalities of touch that run through his work.


An unprecedented look at the little-known paintings from Louise Bourgeois's early years in New York that laid the groundwork for her sculptural practice

Louise Bourgeois (1911–2010) is celebrated today for her sculptures. Less known are the paintings she produced between her arrival in New York in 1938 and her turn to three-dimensional media in 1949. Crucial to her artistic practice, these early works the focus of this groundbreaking publication—show how Bourgeois evolved her deeply personal artistic lexicon. Informed by new archival research and the artist's extensive diaries, *Louise Bourgeois: Paintings* explores Bourgeois's relationship to the New York art world of the 1940s and her development of a unique pictorial language, adding a key element to our understanding of this important artist's career.



The age-old tradition of pictorial illusionism, known as trompe l'oeil ("deceive the eye"), employs visual tricks that confound the viewer's perception of reality and fiction, truth and falsehood. This radically new take on Cubism shows how Pablo Picasso, Georges Braque, and Juan Gris both parodied and paid homage to classic trompe l'oeil themes and motifs. The informed and engaging texts trace the changing status of trompe l'oeil over the centuries, reveal Braque's training in artisanal trompe l'oeil techniques as an integral part of his Cubist practice, examine the materials used in Gris's collages, and discuss the previously unstudied trompe l'oeil iconography within Cubist still lifes including newspapers, word puns, pictures-within-pictures, imitation wood grain, and tools of the trade.

GEORGE GROSZ IN BERLIN The Relentless Eye

A penetrating reevaluation of the period in which the German Expressionist George Grosz created his best-known, most searing satirical works

This overdue investigation of George Grosz's (1893-1959) most compelling paintings, drawings, prints, and collages offers a reassessment of the celebrated German Expressionist during his years in Berlin—from his earliest artistic endeavors to the trenchant satirical images and searing depictions of moral decay between the World Wars for which he is known today. Menacing street scenes, rowdy cabarets, corrupt politicians, wounded soldiers, greedy war profiteers, and other symbols of Berlin's interwar decline all met with the artist's relentless gaze, which exposed the core social issues that eventually led to Germany's extreme nationalist politics. Featuring masterpieces as well as rarely published works, this book provides further insight into the artist's creative pinnacle, reached during this critical and ominous period in German history.



ART AND RELIGION IN MEDIEVAL ARMENIA



This latest volume in The Metropolitan Museum of Art symposia series reprises The Met's blockbuster exhibition *Armenia!* (2018-19)—the first major exhibition on the art of this highly influential culture at the crossroads of the Eastern and Western worlds. Building on the pioneering work of those who first established Armenian studies in America, these essays by a new generation of scholars address Armenia's roles in facilitating exchange with the Mongol, Ottoman, and Persian empires to the East and Byzantium and European Crusader states to the West. Contributors explore the effects of this tension in the history of Armenian art and how those histories persist into the present, as Armenia continues to grapple with the legacy of genocide and counters new threats to its sovereignty, integrity, and culture.
